ENDING THE HIV EPIDEMIC (EHE) in the United States

The EHE goal: reduce new HIV infections in the United States by 75% by 2025 and by 90% by 2030

The AETC Program, funded by the Health Resources and Services Administration's HIV/AIDS Bureau, is one of several programs awarded to provide targeted training to build clinician capacity to address the initiative's 4 key strategies



- Diagnose all people with HIV as early as possible
- Prevent new HIV infections by using proven interventions, including PrEP and PEP and syringe services programs





- Treat people with HIV rapidly and effectively to achieve sustained viral suppression
- 4 Respond quickly to potential HIV outbreaks to get prevention and treatment services to people who need them





Northeast/Caribbean

The EHE initiative focuses on approximately 50 jurisdictions (cities, states, and counties) where new HIV infections are most concentrated. Each of the 8 AETC regions has at least one such jurisdiction
