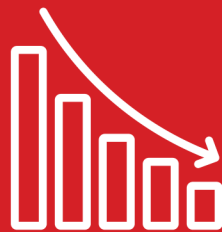


# The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program's AETC Program is working to achieve the goals for **ENDING THE HIV EPIDEMIC (EHE) in the United States**



The EHE goal: reduce new HIV infections in the United States by 75% by 2025 and by 90% by 2030

The AETC Program, funded by the Health Resources and Services Administration's HIV/AIDS Bureau, is one of several programs awarded to provide targeted training to build clinician capacity to address the initiative's 4 key strategies



- 1 Diagnose** all people with HIV as early as possible
- 2 Treat** people with HIV rapidly and effectively to achieve sustained viral suppression
- 3 Prevent** new HIV infections by using proven interventions, including PrEP and PEP and syringe services programs
- 4 Respond** quickly to potential HIV outbreaks to get prevention and treatment services to people who need them



The EHE initiative focuses on approximately 50 jurisdictions (cities, states, and counties) where new HIV infections are most concentrated. Each of the 8 AETC regions has at least one such jurisdiction

Regional AETCs support EHE activities in their jurisdictions with targeted training and technical assistance for healthcare settings responding to at least 1 of the 4 strategies



National AETCs provide clinician-to-clinician consultation and identify, develop, and promote resources to help support regional AETC EHE activities
